# Anthropology Students 2017 Welcome to Meadowlark!

Meadowlark is pleased to welcome a new group of Anthropology students on campus from Kansas State University for the 2017 spring semester!

For the past five years, the Digital Ethnography class taught by Michael Wesch, associate professor of sociology, anthropology and social work, has spent the spring semester living at Meadowlark retirement community. The students have the opportunity to interact with residents while studying the older generation.

This class provides the students real fieldwork conducted in a community that is vastly different from what they commonly encounter. Students in past years have embraced the opportunity to interact with residents who are, in many cases, different than them, and try to generate understanding and compassion for the individuals they interact with. In the process, students gather more than 100 hours of material and find a way to tell a story about it so they can share it to a larger audience.

Based on the relationships the students make with residents each year, the group comes up with a semester project. In past years, students have made documentaries and have arranged comedy shows.

An orientation will take place Friday, Jan. 13, for the students to get better acquainted with Meadowlark, and some will move in that day.

#### Welcome & Introductions, Monte Spiller

Happy New Year! Monte welcomed the Town Meeting attendees. Meadowlark welcomes ten students who will be living on the Meadowlark campus during their duration of their anthropology project.

#### **Campus Update, Lonnie Baker**

Lonnie explained that this past year we have seen many changes in skilled nursing regulations. We've had culture change programs across the state that have had amazing buy-in. In fact, we are one of a few states that have a financial incentive to encourage providers to listen to people. Unfortunately, in recent times, those ideals are coming in conflict with what CMS has been wanting. Lonnie received word last week that one-third of all nonprofits of LeadingAge providers in the state of Kansas have received an immediate jeopardy deficiency in the last 12 months. Meadowlark is working hard to not receive \$250,000 deficiency fines.

Lonnie announced that it is the time of year to start budgeting for 2017 projects around Meadowlark. July 1, is the start of our fiscal year. During the month of January, planning will be arranged to start the exciting projects that will begin after July 1. Lyle House is one project staff anticipates to be renovated in the new year. Lonnie asks if you have any suggestions for projects, to bring those forward.

Looking forward, Meadowlark will be creating more community outreach by expanding Home Health and building onto the Volunteer Program. Meadowlark is hoping to provide services to individuals with VA benefits and serve those who have served our country.
