Great American Eclipse

Update on total solar eclipse excursion By Becky Fitzgerald, Development Director

On August 21, 2017, millions of people across the United States will see nature's most wondrous spectacle — a total eclipse of the Sun. It is a scene of unimaginable beauty; the Moon completely blocks the Sun, daytime becomes a deep twilight, and the Sun's corona shimmers in the darkened sky. This is truly a great American eclipse because totality will sweep the nation from the Pacific to the Atlantic. Nearly everyone in the U.S. can reach this total solar eclipse within one day's drive.

Manhattan residents don't need to travel as far to reach "totality". The path of the total eclipse crosses the northeastern edge of Kansas, and 56 are departing from Meadowlark on that Monday to view the eclipse in Marysville. If you are one of the 56, here's some information to help you plan for the big day.

~ We'll be viewing the eclipse from Lakeview Sports Complex, and the seating there is what you would expect at a small town's outdoor ballpark: aluminum bleachers. Hundreds, if not thousands, are expected to be in Marysville to see the eclipse, so we plan to arrive early in order to ensure we have seats on those bleachers and in plenty of time to see the early phases of the eclipse, which are estimated to begin at 11:37 a.m. in Marysville. Total blackout will happen about 1:03 p.m. and last for approximately 1 minute, 11 seconds.

If you utilize an urgent responder, please bring it to be tested at least every three months to one of the responder clinics held in the Game Room between 1 and 1:30 p.m. every Monday and Thursday. Batteries will also be replaced during clinic times.

At each testing, you will receive a reminder card with the due date for your next urgent responder testing. Please contact Home Health at 537-9497 if you have questions.

Updates

General Update: Lonnie explained we received some great news regarding Medicaid. The state of Kansas restored our rates after a long fought battle. On the flip side, the Senate is working on current legislation to cut significant dollars from the Medicaid budget. There is hope this will not occur and Senator Jerry Moran has spoken up and expressed he is not in favor of the bill.

We are also watching changes in the Medicare structure. There is still a lot of uncertainty of what will happen, but we expect to see restructuring of the Medicare payment procedure. This will mostly affect Meadowlark concerning stays at Bramlage House. PPS is currently the payment system we are under, but the government is asking for feedback regarding completely changing the system in October 2018. Regardless of any changes, Meadowlark will continue to be proactive with looking at options on how we deliver care.

Jayme Minton informed the council that Brook (Niehues) Marcotte will be taking on a new role as Dining Services Leader. Brook will still have a presence in Verna Belle's Café in addition to some new duties.
