Staffing a New Committee: Outdoor Activities

A series of developments over the past several years and across the Meadowlark campus have been designed to improve resident quality of life and safety through participation in a broad array of outdoor activities. It all started with the identification and correction of numerous

pedestrian safety issues. A ad hoc committee led that effort.

Having created safe access conditions, a follow-up ad hoc committee (the Pond Committee) identified, through a resident survey, outdoor activities in which they would like to participate. The scope grew from being largely fishing related to a myriad of activities accessed by attractive trails, benches, docks and shelters. In response to the growth in interest the Pond Committee became the Outdoor Opportunities Committee. Residents generous contributions paid for more than half of the resulting project cost.

As portions of the project were completed nearly three years ago, residents (mostly from the committee) accepted initial use responsibilities. It is now time for the ad hoc committee to sunset and for a standing committee to take its place. Some current members will likely wish to continue while others may not. Monte Spiller, Resident Services Leader, has directed that the reconstituted committee be established as part of the other committee's membership at year end.

Committee members and a committee-elected chair person are needed for operation and future direction of several outdoor activity areas. The staff liaison for the committee will be Monte. Current members and active subjects are listed below for your more completed understanding. Please indicate your interest in becoming a committee member by signing up in the Blue Book. I have found it very rewarding to make it possible for residents and staff to renew their intimacy with nature. I hope you will also.

Opportunity areas: fishing, worm farm, rods & reels, tackle boxes, fish food, stocking fish, aquatic plants, pond water quality, docks, dip nets, administer water-sharing agreement with KSU, trail system expansion, benches, chairs, journal, articles for the Meadowlark Messenger, wildflower observation, quiet contemplation, frog watching, bird watching, butterflies, critter feeding (corn feeder), bees, horseshoes and general promotion.

Medicare update: Social Security Numbers to be removed from cards

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services
(CMS) is removing Social Security Numbers from
Medicare cards starting in 2018

Why is CMS issuing new Medicare Cards and new Medicare numbers? The law requires the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to remove Social Security numbers (SSNs) from all Medicare cards by April 2019. A new unique Medicare number will replace the current Health Insurance Claim Number (HICN) on the new Medicare cards. This step is to protect people with Medicare from fraudulent use of Social Security numbers, which can lead to identity theft and illegal use of Medicare benefits.

When will CMS mail the new cards to people with Medicare? The mailing of the cards will begin in April 2018 and will meet the statutory deadline for replacing all Medicare cards by April 2019. Patients who are new to the Medicare program starting in April 2018 and later will only have a card with the new Medicare number.

What about Medicare Advantage and **Prescription Drug plans?** Medicare Advantage

and Prescription Drug plans will continue to assign and use their own identifiers on their health insurance cards.

When will CMS share information with the public about the new Medicare card design and the mailing schedule? CMS shared information about the new card design in September 2017. The gender and signature line will be removed from the new cards. Mailing everyone a new card will take some time.

People with Medicare may start using their new Medicare cards and as soon as they get them.

The effective date of the new cards, like the old cards, is the date each beneficiary was or is eligible for Medicare.

Things to know about your new Medicare card:

- ~ You don't need to take any action to get your new Medicare card.
- ~ The new card won't change your Medicare coverage or benefits.
- ~ Medicare will never ask you to give personal or private information to get your new Medicare number and card.
- ~There's no charge for your new card.

Watch out for scams! Scam artists may try to get your current Medicare Number and other personal information by contacting you about your new Medicare card. They often claim to be from Medicare and use various scams to get your Medicare Number including:

- ~ Asking you to confirm your Medicare or Social Security Number so they can send you a new card.
- ~Telling you there's a charge for your new card and they need to verify your personal information.
- ~Threatening to cancel your health benefits if you don't share your Medicare Number or other personal information.

If someone calls you and asks for your Medicare Number or other personal information, hang up and call CMS at 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227).
