In 2017, as part of the 100th anniversary of the United States' entry into WWI, Kansas State University formally dedicated World War I Memorial Stadium. The ceremony included the unveiling of new signage proclaiming the stadium's status as a WWI memorial and also recognized the surviving relatives of the 48 Fallen K-Staters.

KSU's precision military drill team, Company G-7 of the National Society of the Pershing Rifles, are continuing the centennial recognition by conducting tributes at World War I Memorial Stadium on the death date anniversary of each of the 48 Fallen students.

"This is K-State's history," said Cadet Maximilian J. Curtis, National Society of Pershing Rifles National Commander and KSU student. "It is important for us to remember those who have come before, to ensure their memory and their sacrifice is not forgotten. When classes are in session we will perform a 24hour silent guard; during semester breaks a wreath will be laid


Patriotic Sing-Along

On When Life Turns a Page

It sounded like a strange assignment from my doctor: "Before you return for your next visit, I want you to do something you've wanted to do but have never done. Something that produces no product. Something that benefits only you."

Good grief. That sounds so selfish. I couldn't remember anything I had wanted to do. But things work out if you let them, I learned.

A big throw-away paper landed in my yard. I scanned its many pages. My attention was caught by a tiny ad that said only: "Santa Anita track bus" and gave a phone number. Santa Anita? The race track! I had always wanted to see a horse race!

I called the number. It was a miracle! Of all huge Los Angeles, the track bus stopped one block from where I lived! I made a reservation. But guilt set in when I thought of spending money only on me. But if, instead of buying pills... My calculations showed I could pay for my venture with pill money, having enough for one \$2 bet.

So, instead of buying pills, I went to my first horse race. All the seats on the track bus were occupied except the one for me. My seatmate was happy to have someone interested in what he had to say. I listened intently. He told me he would teach me a system of betting. "It won't make you rich, but you will have enough you can afford to return to the track."

At the track, I carefully applied his system, studying my Racing Form, watching the odds on the tote board, then placing my \$2 bet. I won. I played all the races and came home with twice as much money as my pill money. I could afford to return to the track!

And return I did, for three years. From Santa Anita to Hollywood Park down to Del Mar by train. All paid for by my winnings. Best of all was the horses, each with their personality, some were characters I've written about.

My life was ready to turn a page from being hellbent on trying to exist in approved obedience. It was time for me to learn the joy of living. And all the little miracles were there waiting, if I would just let it happen. And, centermost in the grand scheme, were those wonderful horses. They drew crowds that included old-timers and people like me, whose life was turning a page. (Now a 96 year old.)

at the World War I Memorial Stadium sign nearest the Wildcat statue."

This past weekend the tribute honored Marine Corp. Howard B. Wood, uncle of Polly Ferrell, Meadowlark Hills resident. Wood was killed in action June 23, 1918 and is buried "where he fell" nearby in the Aisne-Marne American Cemetery, Belleau, France.

The wreath laying ceremony in honor of Corp. Wood was held at 12-noon, Saturday, June 23, at Memorial Stadium. The short military ceremony, patterned after those held at Arlington National Cemetery, was punctual and precise. Cadet Curtis made the presentation, Polly Ferrell was honored to place the wreath for her uncle and Taps was played. Jed Dunham, consultant and researcherwriter with K-State's Office of Military and Veterans Affairs, shared about Corp. Wood's contribution to the WW I mission for which Wood was awarded the Silver Medal. Ten members of the Wood family attended the tribute.

Another permanent visual honor to these 48 Fallen is the historic WW I Memorial Wall in General Richard B. Myers Hall, located on the K-State campus, which may be viewed at anytime the hall is open. Included are individual photos of the KSU 48 Fallen.
