Pogorzelska is a visiting scholar through the European Union ERASMUS+ program and will be hosted by Kansas State University's College of Education. Pogorzelska's presentation is available to the public through a collaboration with KSU College of Education, UFM Community Learning Center, and Meadowlark Hills.

Earl Gritton's Birthday Celebration Sunday, Sept. 30, at 3 p.m.


