restaurant during the lunch and dinner hours.

Live polka music will be provided by accordion player Rusty Schwerdt, Bud Cox's brother-in-law, and a beer tasting and buying station will be operated by Flint Hills Beverage beginning at 5 p.m. Flint Hills Beverage now is a distributor for KC Bier Co., a craft beer brewery in Kansas City offering German-style lagers and ales, and some of those will be on the beer menu for the first time. HOGTOBERFEST would certainly be fun with just barbecue, brews and music, but there's more! In order to create additional opportunities to raise money and awareness for the Good Samaritan Fund, a HOG & Kisses Contest has begun, and 50/50 raffle tickets will be on sale soon. Foundation board, was our top votegetter and hog kisser.


